

Disaggregation of accounts in Indonesia SAM

Activities/ Commodities (17 each)	<i>Agriculture</i> (5): food crops, non- food crops, livestock, forestry, and fishing; <i>Industry</i> : (8): oil, other mining, food processing, light manufacturing, other manufacturing, chemicals and fertilizers, construction, and electricity; <i>Services</i> (4) trade and transportation, banking and insurance, public administration, and other services;
Factors (6)	<i>Labor</i> : Agricultural, Production transport, Clerical sales-services, Professional managerial (including military); <i>Other</i> : Land (including agricultural capital), Capital;
Households (7)	<i>Agricultural</i> : Agricultural employees, Small-medium farmers (own <1 Ha), Large farmer households (own >1 Ha); <i>Non-agricultural</i> : Rural low-income non-agricultural, Rural high-income non-agricultural, Urban low-income non-agricultural, Urban high-income non-agricultural;
Other institutional (6)	Enterprises, Government, Rest of the world, Savings-investment, Domestic net indirect taxes, Import tariffs
Other (3)	Auxiliary accounts for separating trade and transportation costs into three categories: related to exports, imports, and domestic sales.
