



Johan Swinnen is Professor of Economics and Director of the LICOS-Centre for Institutions and Economic Performance at the KU Leuven and Senior Research Fellow at the Centre for European Policy Studies (CEPS) in Brussels. Earlier he was Lead Economist at the World Bank (2003-4) and Economic Advisor at the European Commission (1998-2001). He has served as Visiting Professor at various universities, including the Centre for Food Security and the Environment (FSE) at Stanford University, and is a regular advisor to institutions such as the World Bank, EBRD, OECD, and FAO.

He holds a PhD from Cornell University and Honorary Doctorates from Gottingen University and Nitra University. He has more than 19,000 citations and an h-index of 69 on google scholar. He is a Fellow of the Agricultural & Applied Economics Association (AAEA) and the European Association of Agricultural Economists (EAAE) and was President of the International Association of Agricultural Economists (IAAE) during 2012-15.

He has published widely on agricultural and food policies, international development, political economy, institutional reforms, trade and global value chains. His books include *"The Political Economy of Agricultural and Food Policies"* (2018, Palgrave Macmillan); *"Quality Standards, Value Chains and International Development"* (2015, Cambridge Univ Press); *"Political Power and Economic Policy: Theory and Empirical Applications"* (2011, Cambridge Univ Press); and *"From Marx and Mao to the Market. The Economics and Politics of Agricultural Transition"* (2006, Oxford Univ Press).
