- **Primary male respondent:** The primary male respondent for this study will be the spouse or partner of the midline primary female. If the mother of the baseline index child is not a member of the household, the primary male respondent will be the spouse or partner of the primary female caregiver of the baseline index child. If the mother or primary female caregiver of the baseline index child does not have a spouse or partner who is a member of the household, the primary male respondent will be an adult male household member who plays a leading role in household decision-making, particularly concerning farming, household economic activity and expenditures.

Coronavirus is also spread when an infected person talks, coughs or sneezes and those droplets land on an object that someone else later touches and then touches their own face. It is possible for someone to spread the virus before they even know that they are infected.

Washing your hands for 20 seconds with soap and water frequently, covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue, throw the tissue away, and then wash your hands, avoiding touching your eyes, nose, and mouth, cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects or surfaces such as doors, avoiding close contact with people that are sick, staying home if you are sick and maintaining physical distance of at least 2 adult steps from others when outside your household can help protect you from Coronavirus infection.
